Policy  
on symbolism and flags at events  
dedicated to Victory Day

Victory Day Organization Committee recognizes, welcomes, and encourages the use of all respective symbols of the forces of the Great Patriotic War and symbols of the USSR as a victorious state: the red Victory Banner, the flags of the USSR and the union republics of the USSR, the St. George's (Guard's) ribbon, the symbols of orders and medals from the Great Patriotic War and the Soviet period, banners of the fronts, and flags of the branches of the Soviet Army.

The Victory Day Organization Committee also recognizes and encourages the use of historical and contemporary symbols and flags of fraternal states who actively fought against nazism and militarism and provided assistance to the USSR in the joint anti-fascist struggle – the PRC, Mongolia, and the DPRK.

Since we hold our events in the USA, the Orgcommittee also considers it important and recommends that the flag and symbols of the United States of America be used at our events as part of the Victory celebration and commemoration.

The Russian Federation has a special role as the successor of the USSR and as a state where the preservation of historical accounts of the Great Victory is the foundation of state policy. Today, the Russian Federation is at the forefront of the international struggle against modern-day nazism and historical revisionism, therefore the Victory Day Organization Committee welcomes and encourages all state symbols of the Russian Federation at its events, in particular the Russian national tri-color flag.

We also encourage feature participation of the official state flags of the Republic of Belarus as part of the Union State of Russia and Belarus at events organized by the Orgcommittee.

The Victory Day Organization Committee considers any attempts to prohibit or restrict the above-mentioned symbols and banners at events dedicated to Victory Day, whether that be Soviet or Russian symbols, as well as any other Victory Day-related symbols - to be absolutely unacceptable, no matter where or who these attempts originate from.

At last, the Orgcommittee entrusts final decision-making to members of the local organizing team, and expects enforcement of all Orgcommittee by-laws and policies from members of the local team - based upon local circumstances and the utmost benefit to the event participants and the general public.
